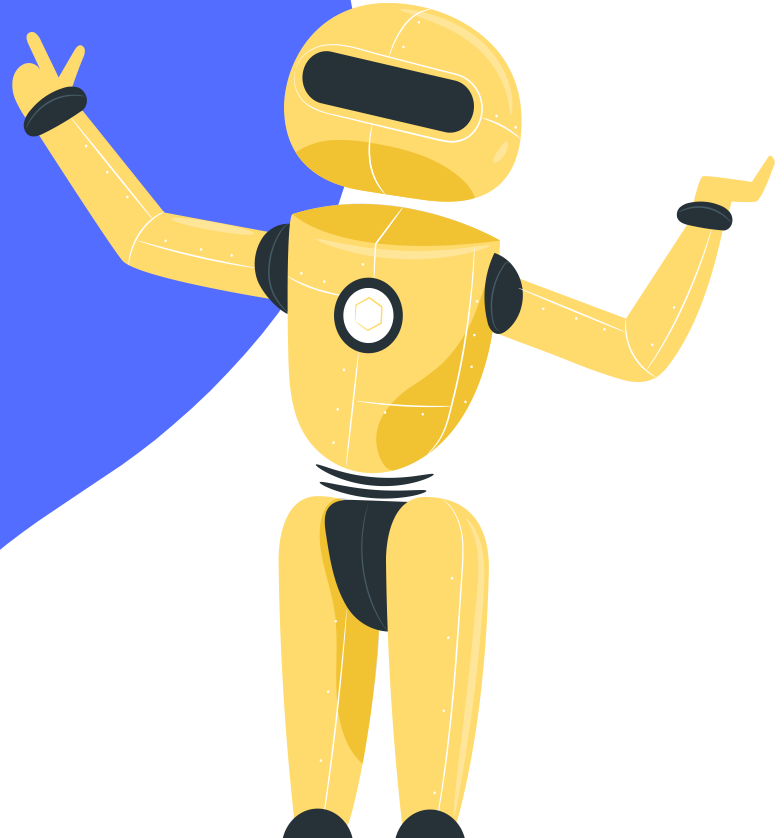


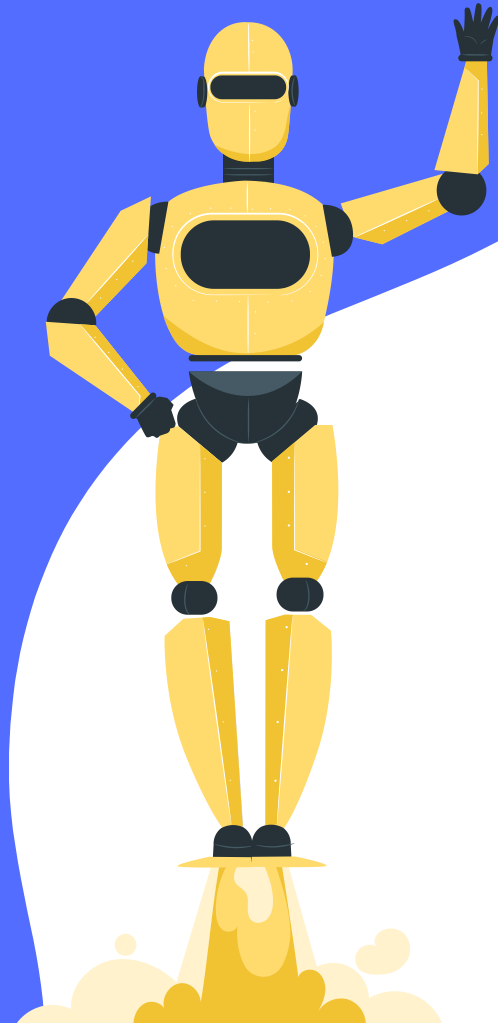
# Autonomous weapon systems: Should they Kill?

# What is an Autonomous Weapon System (AWS)?

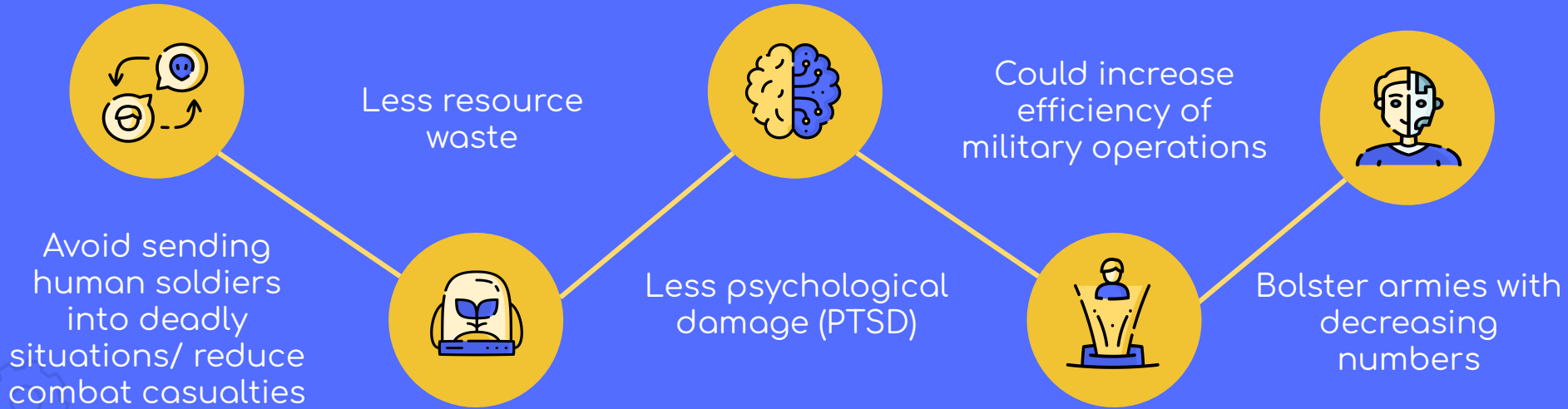
- Military weapons that do not need to be remotely controlled
  - act unsupervised, adapt to new situations, and learn from their mistakes
  - responsible for identifying targets, navigating towards targets, positioning, aiming, firing, and reloading their weapons without any outside human intervention

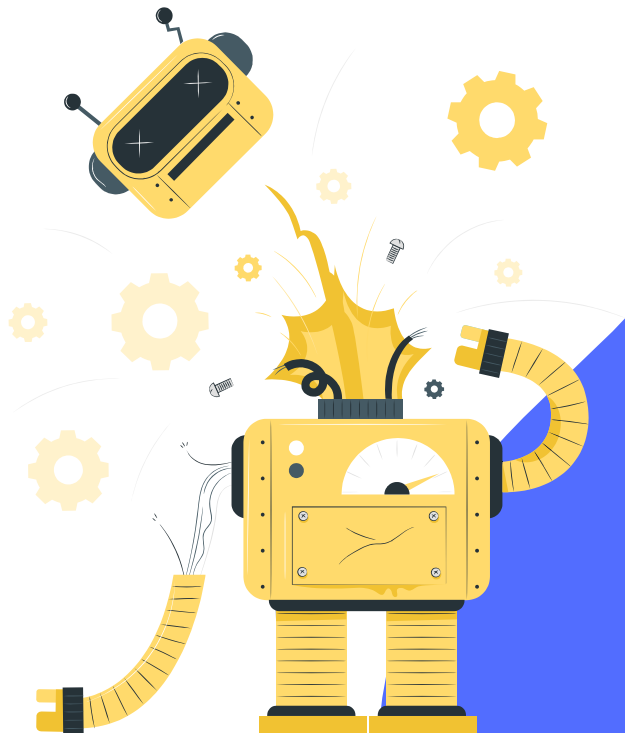

# Problems with Using AWS in War

- Potential malfunctions
- Loss of human dignity
- Aspect of deciding who can authorize its activation
- Technology can be stolen and used against the original deployers
  - Hard to retaliate against AWS

# Utilitarianism

## What is it?

- When action leads to a societies net gain in happiness it is ethically justified
- No individuals benefits are more or less important than anyone else's
- What will have the best consequences for everyone?



## Implications

- Increase in civilian or soldier casualties → unethical
- Decrease in civilian or soldier casualties → ethical
- Increase in one and decrease in the other → uncertain without real casualty numbers/ data



# John Rawls Veil of Ignorance

## What is it?

- The idea that a decision maker will not know their race, ethnicity, age, gender, income, etc.
- Does not allow the decision maker to know who they are in the situation



## Implications

- The decision maker could be using AWS or fighting against AWS
- Personally, I would not want to be in a position of fighting AWS making its use unethical



# Objectivism

## What is it?

- People should act in their own self-interest and promote their own well-being
- People should think rationally
- Self serving but not at the expense of others



## Implications

- Acting in self interest one would claim it ethical to use AWS so they do not have to go to war
- However, this may be seen as being at the expense of others making it unethical



# Conclusion

- Using Utilitarianism AWS can be ethical or unethical depending on the number of deaths
- Using the Veil of Ignorance AWS is unethical because you would not want to fight AWS
- Using Objectivism AWS is unethical because it would be self serving but at the expense of others
